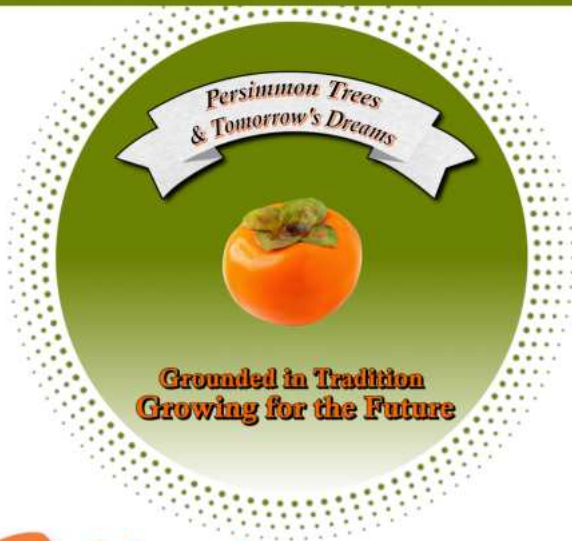

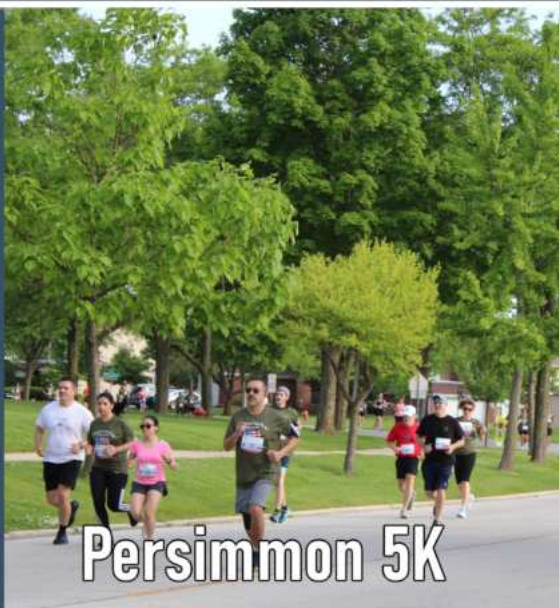

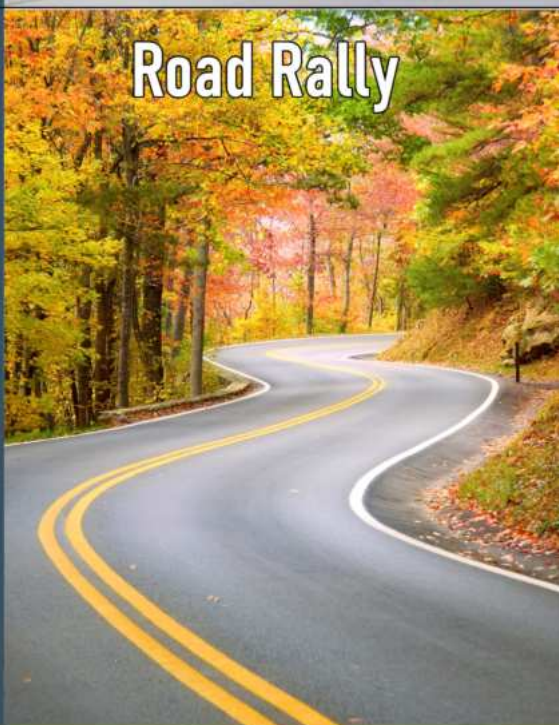

Persimmon Pudding

INGREDIENTS

2 CUPS PERSIMMON PULP
2 CUPS SUGAR
3 EGGS
1 1/2 CUPS BUTTERMILK
1 TSP. BAKING SODA
1/4 CUP CREAM, HALF & HALF
1/2 STICK MELTED MARGARINE/BUTTER
1/4 TSP. VANILLA
1 1/2 CUPS FLOUR
1 TSP. BAKING POWDER
1/4 TSP. SALT
1/4 TSP. CINNAMON

DIRECTIONS

1. Combine pulp, eggs, & sugar in a bowl.
2. In a separate bowl, combine buttermilk & soda, mix until it foams up a little.
3. Add buttermilk & soda mixture to pulp mixture.
4. Sift dry ingredients & add alternately with the milk.
5. Add butter & vanilla.
6. Coat a 9x13 inch baking dish or two 8x8 inch dishes with butter or margarine (melt the 1/2 stick butter or margarine in baking dish & then pour in the batter).
7. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes to 1 hour.

Pumpkin Spice Caramels

INGREDIENTS

1 STICK BUTTER
1 1/2 CUPS SUGAR
1/2 TSP. GROUND CINNAMON
1/2 TSP. GROUND GINGER
1/4 TSP. GROUND ALLSPICE
1 CUP LIGHT CORN SYRUP
14 OZ. CAN SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK
3/4 CUP PERSIMMON PULP

DIRECTIONS

1. Prepare a 9-inch square pan by lightly buttering it or lining it with parchment paper.
2. In heavy 2 to 3-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add sugar and spices: thoroughly blend
3. Add corn syrup, sweetened condensed milk, and persimmon pulp – stirring well after each addition.
4. Continue to cook over medium heat, stirring frequently to prevent scorching, until the temperature of the mixture reaches 240° F (soft ball stage)
5. Remove from heat and pour mixture evenly into the prepared pan
6. When cool, turn candy out of pan and cut into 3/4 inch squares. Wrap individual pieces in 2 3/4 to 3-inch squares of waxed paper. Store in airtight container.
