We are pleased to inform you that North Lawrence Community Schools will be implementing the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for meals served on the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2026-2027 school year at Lincoln Elementary School.

All students enrolled at **LINCOLN ELEMENTARY** are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at no charge each school day of the 2026-2027 school year. No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) who attend Lincoln Elementary will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.

However, **please note**: *If you have a child or student at a school other than Lincoln Elementary, you would need to submit an application for them (if you have not already done so for the 2026-2027 school year or if you have not already received a determination of benefits letter for the 2026-2027 school year) if you would like them to be considered for Free or Reduced meal benefits.*
